Packing for Camp

GEAR LIST...

The following list is provided to help you prepare for Ski & Snowboard Camp. Of course you may choose to add other items to this list. There are no laundry facilities available at camp, so it is very important to pack enough clothing to get through the entire week of camp. **Please be aware that Ski & Snowboard Camp is technology free!**

Toiletries	Extra Warm Clothes	Ski Pants / Ski Parka / Jacket
Socks	Sweaters / Fleece	Helmet (<i>mandatory; may be rented</i>)
Underwear	Thermal Socks / Underwear	Ski Goggles
Pajamas	Mittens / Gloves / Hat	Ski / Board Equipment (<i>may be rented</i>)
Pants / Jeans	Comfortable Indoor Footwear	Swimsuit (<i>we have an indoor pool</i>)
Shirts	Outdoor Boots / Shoes	Towels (<i>for both bathing & swimming</i>)

*Face Mask – optional; face masks are not required at camp, but campers may choose to wear one.

*Flashlight – optional; recommended

*Camera – optional; camp creates lots of memories to capture (traditional cameras only – no cell phones!)

*Ice Skates – optional; we have limited pairs that may be borrowed – best to bring your own.

*Bed Linens & Blankets – not needed; provided by camp (beds will be made up and ready for use upon arrival.)

Spending Money...

Spending money is not necessary. I get nervous when kids have lots of cash at camp. That said; many campers will bring some cash because they have limited access to the snack bar and gift shop at King Pine Ski Area. Campers should understand that they are responsible for their own money.

Cell Phones / Texting Devices...

Cell phones and texting devices are **NOT** welcome at Ski & Snowboard Camp. For kids travelling long distance by bus or plane and carrying a phone for safe travel purposes, that phone shall be locked in the camp safe for the duration of camp. In terms of communication, please see the document titled, *'Being in Touch with Your Child'*.

Video Players...

Video players and gaming devices are **NOT** welcome at Ski & Snowboard Camp. We will provide / create other types of entertainment as a core part of our program.

Music Players...

iPods, MP3 Players and other types of audio entertainment ARE acceptable, but ONLY ones that do not have a video component. Music players must also include headphones.

Traditional Cameras...

Cameras are a wonderful way to capture special camp memories. With that, we expect good judgment to be exercised before posting photos / images representing Ski & Snowboard Camp at online social media sites. Camp will respond if we discover posted photos / images which may be interpreted as negative representations of camp.

Laptop Computers...

Personal computers are NOT welcome at Ski & Snowboard Camp for recreational use. The ONLY acceptable use is for homework which must be completed while at camp. Computers will be secured in the camp office and available for use only during scheduled and supervised homework periods.

Food / Snacks...

Please **DO NOT** send snack food to camp. This is explained in the *"Keeping the Kids Healthy"* document.

HOW TO PACK IT ALL...

Campers will essentially live out of whatever they pack their gear in. Unfortunately, our bunks are not high enough for standard trunks to squeeze under. Some campers have chosen to use those plastic pull-out units that stand maybe 2 or 3 drawers high. Most often campers use some sort of duffle bag or suitcase to hold clothing. These are nice as they are often able to be stashed under beds and out of the way.
